Whilst the closing date for the consultation has passed we felt it important to highlight the following proposed increase in yellow lines in the village.

roposed increase in yellow lines in the Village.

'Cambridgeshire County Council the District of South Cambridgeshire (Civil Enforcement Area) (Waiting Restrictions and Street Parking Places) Order 2023 (Amendment No. 10) Order 20—

Notice is hereby given that Cambridgeshire County Council proposes to make the above-named Order under the powers contained in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) and the Traffic Management Act 2004 (as amended). The effect of this Order will be to prohibit waiting at any time (install double yellow lines) on the following lengths of roads in Linton:

- the southeastern side of High St, from near its junction with Symonds Ln to its junction with Cambridge Rd, extending south-eastwards along both sides of Horn Ln (approx. 13m and 19.5m along the northern and southern sides respectively);
- the northwestern side of High St from its junction with Market Ln south-eastwards for 21.5m, between points 5.5m northeast and 3m southwest of its junction with Meadow Ln & between points 27m east and 25m west of its junction with Symonds Ln; both sides of Symonds Ln from its junction with High St northwards for 82m, extending 29.5m north-eastwards along both sides of Hillway.

And in addition to install: 3 free parking bays on High St between 5m and 23m east of its junction with Meadow Ln; a disabled parking bay and 3 free parking bays between 3m and 28m southwest of its junction with Meadow Ln; a disabled parking bay outside No. 13 High Street.

Flu Vaccinations 2024

THIS year, NHS England have informed us the routine annual adult Flu programme for adults aged 18 years old upwards will start on the 3rd October. To ensure you have maximum protection for the flu season you should be vaccinated in October preferably, but certainly by the end of November. Flu numbers start to rise in November and peak in December and January. However, there are three groups of people who should be vaccinated early and we encourage you to be vaccinated in one of our September clinics. These are:

- Those who are pregnant (especially if near due date)-, because pregnant women are at higher risk from complications from flu. Early vaccination protects the baby during pregnancy (for example, flu infection increases the risk of the baby being premature or stillborn) as well as protecting the baby in the first few months of life (babies aged under 6 months are at high risk of complications from flu).
- Children- because the protection from the flu vaccine lasts longer in children and because children tend to be "super spreaders"So getting your child vaccinated not only protects your child but also their grandparents, vulnerable parents and reduces the spread of flu to the wider population.
- People due to have treatment such as chemotherapy, because: If you are due to have treatment that will weaken your immune

system the vaccine given before treatment starts will work better as your immune system is stronger.

If you are eligible then there are two Flu clinic dates in September: Saturday 28^{th} September – Granta Sawston and Sunday 29^{th} September – Granta Royston Health Centre (see September eligibility above)

In October we are running flu clinics as follows

Saturday 5th October - Granta Sawston;

Saturday 5th October – Granta Linton:

Sunday 6th October - Granta Royston Health Centre;

Saturday 12th October - Granta Barley;

Saturday 12th October – Granta Shelford;

Saturday 19th October – Granta Sawston; Saturday 19th October – Granta Linton;

Sunday 20th October – Granta Royston Health Centre;

Saturday 26th October - Granta Shelford.





THE Hundred Parishes has an exceptional depth of ancient buildings. More than 6,000 are "listed", meaning that they appear on the National Heritage List for England. Each property listing includes a description and many of these descriptions take their text from the guide books produced by one exceptional man, Nikolaus Pevsner. Pevsner, an architectural historian, was born in 1902 in Leipzig, Germany, the son of a Russian-Jewish fur merchant. In 1933 he moved to England and settled in Hampshire. Following the outbreak of World War II, he was taken to an internment camp but was released three months later.

Work on his series of architectural guide books, The Buildings of England, began in 1945. The edition covering the whole of Hertfordshire was published in 1953; Essex and Cambridgeshire followed in 1954. Most of the ancient architecture in The Hundred Parishes is mentioned by Pevsner in these three editions, either in general terms or in great detail. In Cambridgeshire, he described the Norman interior of Ickleton's parish church as having few equals in the country. In Hertfordshire, the 17th-century almshouses in Buntingford were described by Pevsner as "the stateliest almshouses in the county". Nikolaus Pevsner was granted British citizenship in 1946, appointed CBE in 1953 and knighted in 1969 "for services to art and architecture". In total, he was responsible for 46 county-wide guides. He died in Hampstead, London in 1983

Country Matters

Sunflowers- all you need to know

WHAT could be more joyous than even one large sunflower in a vase, never mind acres of them in a field? On a bad day stuck a vase, never initial actes of them in a field. On a bad day study in traffic, you can look out and see a beguiling sight, and forget your troubles for a moment. And you can always remember their name, unlike so many flowers. Much as I love to find the delicate orchids hiding in the long grass, or wispy vetch on the roadside, there is something to be said for that brassy, blousy college when off per high years bread love on the prickly. yellow show off, each with coarse broad leaves and a prickly stem, waving at you.

These days farmers and horticulturists use their sunflower fields as a tourist attraction, like lavender fields. Roll up, pay your fee, and get a free coffee. Sunflowers are a globally important crop, more than 50 million tonnes are grown annually, with endless different varieties bred to resist disease. varieties been to resist disease.

The earliest evidence of sunflowers is in Mexico in 2500BC. Native Americans grew them in rotation with corn, beans and squash. They came from the Americas in the 16th century, carried back to Europe by the Spanish, and now over half the global crop is grown in Russia and in Ukraine. They are the national symbol of Ukraine, a symbol of hope, resistance and unity.

Sunflowers are of the daisy family, Asteraceae, and the main variety is Helianthus Annus, typically growing to 3 metres, but the record height is 9.17 metres. Like most people I thought the flower heads tracked the sun, known as heliotropic, but this is apparently not true. Only the young unformed flowers orient themselves towards the sun. When they mature they face east

The list of uses of sunflowers is very impressive. Oil from the seeds is used in cooking, margarine manufacture, biodiesel and soap. The global market for bird seeds is growing – Ben is forever topping up our feeder, while I shovel them onto his breakfast. After seed removal the remaining flower head "cake" is fed to livestock. They can even remove toxic elements from soil, and were used in Chernobyl and

For the mathematical among you, each floret is orientated towards the rest by the golden angle of 137.5 degrees, where the number of left and right spirals are successive Fibonacci numbers. Way beyond me. There are 34 spirals in one direction and 55 in the other. This pattern produces the most efficient packing of seeds mathematically possible in the flowerhead. Astounding.

But for the more artistic, you can visit Van Gogh's Sunflowers in the National Gallery, created out of 3 tints of yellow and nothing else. Van Gogh painted sunflowers all his life, reflecting his struggles and his hopes. As he had hoped, sunflowers in their hundreds were brought to his funeral. What a lasting legacy for us all.

District and County Councillors' Report, August 2024

Four Day Week

The District Council are now at the end of their fifteen months' trial of a four-day working week. The results of this have been analysed by two independent universities, Cambridge and Salford. They found that, out of the 24 key performance indicators measured, 22 showed that performance had increased or remained the same. The two that showed a decrease in performance were the amount of time to collect housing rent and the time taken to re-let council housing stock. Staff turnover over the time period, especially in 'hard to fill' posts such as senior planners, has dropped by 40%. Eleven bin lorry drivers left the council in 2022 whilst only five did in all of 2023 and 2024. The next steps for the council will be to digest this, offer a consultation, and then make a decision whether to make the four-day week permanent.

The old HQ of the County Council, Shire Hall in Cambridge, has been on the market to be sold since the authority moved from there a few years ago. After some years on the market, it now has a new buyer, who will be turning the historic building into a luxury hotel. As the building has many parts which are listed, the new operator will need to be careful when renovating.

Holiday Voucher Scheme
The County Council will again offer its supermarket voucher scheme to eligible families this summer holiday period. Every application can also help with some funding towards the child's school, if they are also in receipt of Free School Meals. Planning Matters Guidance and Information

Material Planning Considerations

"You can please some of the people all of the time, you can please all of the people some of the time, but you can't please all of the people all of the time"

John Lydgate



Linton Parish Council receive notifications from the Greater Cambridge Shared Planning (GCSP) department of all active planning and tree works applications and are invited to submit comments as the Parish Consults within a specified time frame.

The Parish Council do not have the power to approve or refuse an application, this is the responsibility of the GCSP, however we can bring to the attention of the Planning officers matters which are of concern if identified in an application.

We can support an application without comment or suggest certain conditions be applied usually during any construction phase, (limiting the times that machinery can run or where contractors can park their vehicles – that sort of thing). When considering whether to support an application or not, we are bound to follow what are known as Material Planning Considerations.

These set out circumstances that may well result in an application, being declined. If we feel that such circumstances apply we may well choose not to support the application citing the relevant material consideration(s).

By and large most applications, leaving aside major housing developments, fall into the area of extensions to existing houses or other modifications to property and occasionally the building of a dwelling on a plot within the village envelope (in-fill).

Provided the proposed plan falls within the planning considerations we would support it, possibly with suggested conditions.

Planning applications involving a listed building or property within the conservation area.

The consideration applied here; 'is the proposal appropriate with regard to heritage, including listed buildings, scheduled ancient monuments or other heritage assets nearby'. We would urge anyone thinking of submitting a proposal in these circumstances to seek some advice from the Parish Office who will be happy to point out what needs to be considered.

IF AS A parishioner you have a view or objection to a planning application that you feel will adversely affect your circumstances you have a right to submit an objection directly to the Greater Cambridge Shared Planning portal Again, you can get advice on how to do this from the Parish Office.

The following are not material planning considerations as defined by national regulations and case law, and will not be considered in any decision on a planning application:

- The loss of a private view from your property.
- A boundary dispute between neighbours.
 Loss of trade from competing businesses.
- Loss of value to your property.
- · Moral objections e.g. to a betting shop or amusement arcade.
- · Personal circumstances e.g. a personal dislike of the applicant.
- Matters controlled by other legislation e.g. structural issues which are covered by Building Regulations.

This is not an exhaustive list by any means, so consider

some advice before making your objections.

And here's a circumstance that may seem bizarre, it is not a material consideration for objection should an individual or organisation apply for planning permission on land you own without your permission.

without your permission.

Speedwatch Update July 2024

THE Speedwatch Team in Linton have been very active during the 1st half of 2024.

We have 5 locations within the village where vehicle

we have a lower within the venture where venture speeds are monitored. High St, Balsham Rd, Hadstock Rd, Back Rd and Horseheath Rd. Most locations allow the monitoring of traffic in both directions. Since the last update, we have acquired a 2nd set of Speedwatch equipment which allows the monitoring of vehicles in both directions to the carrier time. directions at the same time.

Dual sessions have already been completed within the village and all data is used for monitoring each location and volume of traffic inbound/outbound and time of the day.

The results by location for the 1st half of the year are as

follows:

The data collected from sessions is part of the data analyzed that determines where additional speed reduction measures could be implemented. This remains an ongoing process and expect to see more information released on measures to be introduced throughout the village



By the time this article appears, the team will have completed another "Speedwatch Marathon"...10 sessions within the same week covering all locations, early and late morning, afternoon and early evening. Results from the sessions will be published later in the year.

Thank you to all volunteers who give up their personal time to assist with Speedwatch, we are a small but very committed team with the aim of keeping motorists and pedestrians safe as they drive or walk through the village. It is quite incredible that some vehicles have been reported after more than DOUBLING the speed limit, 42mph on High St (limit 20mph) and 63mph on Balsham Rd (limit 30mph).


